Dear President Obama,

I am writing to urge you to appoint a federal Co-Chair to the Northern Border Regional Commission. Following the passage of \$3 million in funding for the Northern Border Regional Commission (NBRC) by the House of Representatives, I am hopeful that you will take the final step in putting this Commission to work.

In order for the Commission to invest in the belt of counties along the Northern border from Maine through New York, a federal co-chair must be appointed. The Commission is intended to provide funding for regional infrastructure needs as identified by states. The Commission is a federal-state partnership tailored to the specific needs of the region.

The Commission will significantly improve the economy of the Northern Border region by building on the area's longer-term ability to compete. The Commission was formally authorized by Congress as part of Public Law 6124, with an initial funding level of \$30 million annually. The House of Representatives included \$3 million for the Commission in the Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2010. I am optimistic this funding will be included in the Senate version of the bill.

The Commission is mandated to invest in transportation infrastructure, broadband infrastructure, health care facilities, job training, small business development, and alternative energy projects. In order to bring economic development to the region, the Commission must have a federally appointed Co-Chair before it can formally be established.

I respectfully request that as Congress finalizes the appropriations for the Northern Border Regional Commission to send to the White House for your signature, you appoint a federal Co-Chair for the NBRC. This would provide immediate help and longer term investment to help this large, multi-state region.
